#### **KABBALAT SHABBAT**

Weekly themed, student-led Shabbats with homemade kosher meals brought together between 30–100 students for meaningful connection and community.

#### **The Jewish Learning Fellowship**

The Jewish Learning Fellowship at GSU Hillel was a 7-week journey where students explored Judaism, identity, and values through deep, honest conversation. Rooted in Jewish texts and tradition, the program creates space for students to ask big questions about identity, purpose, and values without judgment or expectation. By building community and sparking personal growth, JLF represented the heart of GSU Hillel's mission to create meaningful, inclusive Jewish experiences.

#### **ISRAELFEST**

300+ participants gathered for an interactive "tour of Israel" and powerful tributes to October 7 victims. Despite antisemitic threats and hate speech, the event remained peaceful thanks to proactive security and strong institutional support.



#### **JEWISH LEARNING FELLOWSHIP**

KSU welcomed two JLF cohorts this year, including a "Life's Big Questions" group in partnership with GSU and a returning JLF 2.0 cohort of alumni eager to dive deeper into Jewish learning.



#### **KOL YISRAEL**

Ten students participated in the Kol Yisrael cohort, where thoughtful discussions and meaningful connections were built around shared identity and values.

### 10 UNIQUE CAMPUSES. ONE SHARED IMPACT.

#### Hillels of Georgia is proud to connect Jewish students and community members statewide.

Despite the distinct identities of each of our 10 campus Hillels, Hillels of Georgia serves as the umbrella organization that unites them all. Hillels of Georgia is consistently building a connected, statewide movement for Jewish life on campus. While each Hillel reflects the unique culture of its university, together they form a vibrant and collaborative network that strengthens Jewish student engagement across Georgia.

In Fiscal Year 2025, Hillels of Georgia proudly hosted a series of impactful statewide initiatives that brought students together beyond their individual campuses. These included:









### **An Evening with Naftali Bennett**

In November 2024, Hillels of Georgia hosted former Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett at The Temple in Atlanta.

The sold out event was standing room only, with over 520 students, university leaders, and community members joining together for an unforgettable evening.





#### **Unprecedented Access, Unifying Impact**

Students, representing all ten campus Hillels across Georgia, gathered for the rare opportunity to hear directly from a former Prime Minister of Israel. The event showcased the strength of Hillels of Georgia as a statewide movement: amplifying Jewish connection, identity, and leadership through shared experiences and meaningful dialogue.





#### **Collaboration with University Leadership**

The presence of multiple university presidents and civic leaders underscored a shared commitment to supporting Jewish students and addressing pressing issues such as antisemitsim and campus climate. Their engagement signaled a critical recognition: that fostering safe, inclusive, and informed environments for Jewish life on campus is not only a Jewish concern; it's a priority for institutions across Georgia.



#### Off-the-Record, On-Point

Prime Minister Bennett's conversation was held off the record, fostering a private, candid atmosphere that invited real dialogue.

His message to Jewish students was clear.
They must continue to:

Connect with Israel. Stay informed. Speak up.



#### **Content Creators Forum**

In its inaugural year at Hillels of Georgia, the Content Creators Forum was packed with engaging sessions and interactive workshops, fostering creativity and skills in storytelling, social media, and Jewish diversity.



Thirty individual students representing seven Georgia campuses participated in the Content Creators Forum.





Sessions included a media bias discussion with Josh Levs and Jackie Gold, an exclusive briefing with Consul General Anat Sultan-Dadon, and hands-on content creation workshops led by Logan Swerdloff and Aron Goodman.

In its largest, sold out year, Stand with Hillel 2025 brought together over 350 supporters, students, and leaders to celebrate the impact of Hillels of Georgia and reaffirm its commitment to Jewish life on campus.



The evening honored Lisa and Seth Greenberg, Consul General Anat Sultan-Dadon, and featured powerful student voices, moving tributes, and the announcement of the new Mike Leven Leadership Institute.

Student engagement with Hillel programming increased by 6% compared to FY24.


